



## **QUEEN STREET RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

### **CONSTRUCTION ADVISORY NOTICE / ROAD CLOSURE**

The Municipality is continuing work on the Queen Street Reconstruction Project. Construction activities are scheduled to resume the week of April 13, 2026, weather permitting and subject to suitable site conditions.

Work will begin on Queen Street near High Street and proceed south to English Street. Construction activities will include excavation and placement of the road base, installation of curb and gutter, sidewalks, topsoil and sod, and asphalt paving.

#### **ROAD CLOSURE**

Queen Street, between High Street and English Street, will be closed to vehicular traffic during construction. The closure is expected to begin the week of April 13, 2026 and remain in place for approximately five (5) weeks. Updates will be provided should the duration of the closure change.

Emergency Services, school bus operators, and waste collection services will be notified in advance of the confirmed start date.

#### **WATER SERVICING**

No water service disruptions are anticipated during the 2026 construction work. If any temporary disruptions become necessary, advance notice will be provided to affected properties.

#### **FINAL ASPHALT SURFACE**

The final surface asphalt will be placed following completion of the road works between High Street and English Street. This work will require an additional short-term road closure of approximately two (2) days. Once asphalt is placed in front of your property, please allow approximately four (4) hours before driving on the new surface to ensure proper cooling and curing.

Please note that final asphalt paving will also be required on Metcalfe Street (between Arthur Street and Queen Street). This work will be coordinated with Middlesex County.

We appreciate your patience and cooperation during construction. These improvements will enhance the safety, accessibility, and long-term performance of the roadway and underground infrastructure. Project contact information is provided on the reverse side should you have any questions.
