Public Art & Interim Use Program

The Public Art & Interim Use program is intended to encourage the enhancement and promotion of local art and culture and support innovative interim uses on vacant / underdeveloped private lands to eliminate activity gaps or "dead zones" in the core areas of the Municipality.

Incentive Options

Eligible Areas

Construction Costs Matching Grant (Barrier-Free Works) 50% of Construction Costs, up to \$7,500

Entire Municipality

Professional Fees Matching Grant

50% Professional Fee costs, up to \$1,500

Eligible Works

- Works reasonably associated with the installation of new, or enhancement of existing, permanent public art display, such as but not limited to:
 - o Murals:
 - o Statues; and/or
 - o Displays.
- Works associated with the establishment of a temporary or "interim" use on vacant or underdeveloped private property, wherein it may be reasonably enjoyed and/or used by the general public. Eligible interim uses may include, but are not limited to:
 - o community garden;
 - parklet improvements;
 - o bee-hotels/gardens; and/or
 - o semi-permanent or seasonal kiosks/stands used for the retail of foods or produce.
- Professional fees for any designs or services reasonably associated with the works above.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Construction costs may include capital costs for semi-permanent amenities, structures or improvements;
- 2. Preference will be given to proposals that celebrate or represent the local history, culture, identity, and/or heritage of the community and which will be situated within a high visibility and/or prominent location;
- **3.** Preference will be given to proposals that are associated with uses that are open/accessible for public enjoyment and/or which directly involve public art;
- **4.** All proposed interim uses must not prevent the complete restoration of the lands to their original condition, and will not constitute a permanent change to the intended underlying land use designation
- **5.** Any uses involving the housing or keeping of livestock and/or which may, in the opinion of the Municipality, negatively impact the surrounding lands or area, are not eligible for funding
- 6. All proposed interim uses must be permitted in the Strathroy-Caradoc Zoning By-law.
- 7. Proposed interim uses on contaminated properties are not eligible for funding under this program.
